Testing for the batch process, and the Re-sync function that completes the loop, are still pending but we should be in good shape now that these two issues are out of the way.

Steering now needs to evaluate whether to manage this deliverable as an extended portion of Phase 1b, or remove it from the project and handle it as a separate development effort in an operational development cycle.
